TAXES

The 2nd installment of property taxes is due by July 31, 2023, to the Manitowoc County Treasurer.

BUILDING PERMITS

Any improvements or repair costing **\$1,000** or more require a building permit. Permit applications are available from the Village Office or can be found on the village's website: saintnazianz.org. The building inspector, Roger Mayer, will issue and deliver the permits. If you do not obtain a building permit prior to starting a project, you are subject to having your permit fee doubled.

ATTENTION DOG WALKERS!

Be responsible and scoop your poop. Please be sure to have proper clean-up materials with you and immediately clean up after your pet.

WATER SOFTENER INSPECTIONS

As a reminder, the first inspection for all softeners is due May 1, 2024. A Water Softener Inspection Form is available on the village's website: saintnazianz.org or at the Village Office. Please return your inspection documentation to the village once your softener is inspected.

ELECTIONS

2024 will be a busy election cycle. You can either register online at myvote.wi.gov, in-person at the village office, or in-person on Election Day. You must provide proof of residence when registering. All proof of residence documents must include the **voter's name** and **current residential address** (*this is a street address, not a PO Box*). For more information on proof of residence go to myvote.wi.gov. All elections are held at the Village Hall, 228 West Main Street.

Election Schedule for 2024:

- Spring Primary – Tuesday, February 20
- Spring & Presidential Preference Election – Tuesday, April 2
- Partisan Primary – Tuesday, August 13
- General Election – Tuesday, November 5

REPORTING STREETLIGHT PROBLEMS

Do you have a streetlight that is not working properly? You can report the problem directly to WPS. Simply go to the WPS website: wisconsinpublicservice.com/secure/ssl/acct/street_light to complete and submit a short form. You will need the pole number, located on a metal plate on the pole (normally a 6-digit number-letter combination).

NO BURNING

Only recreational campfires for cooking purposes are allowed. No burning garbage, leaves, sticks, grass, or household rubbish. Burn barrels are NOT allowed in the village.

GOLF CARTS, ATV'S OR UTV'S

No vehicles/ATV/Golf Carts are allowed in the park other than the parking lot.

CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT

Included with this newsletter is the annual Consumer Confidence Report for the St Nazianz Water Utility.

4TH OF JULY

With the July 4th holiday fast approaching, remember that it is illegal to shoot off fireworks in the village. All fireworks that are shot into the air are illegal and could pose a threat to neighboring property and roofs.

SUMMER CLEANUP AND PROPERTY GUIDELINES

Summer is a time to enjoy the outdoors, please do your part in keeping your property well maintained. Note the following guidelines when maintaining your property:

- **Trim Your Trees.** Please trim your trees that hang over the street. They should be trimmed behind the curb and 14' above the street. Call if you have questions.
- **General Yard Maintenance.** Please cut and/or trim your yards including the back yards of your property. Do not blow your grass clippings onto streets -- it blocks up the storm sewers. Please mow the edge of your lawn along the curb so the grass blows into your yard. Long grass and weeds provide a habitat for wild animals that we do not want to come into the village. You must remove all junk from your yard.
- **Unlicensed Inoperable Vehicles.** All vehicles must be licensed and operable to remain on your property. If not, they are considered junk vehicles and must be removed from the Village. See ordinance: **Sec. 34-151. – Junked vehicles and appliances on private property.**
Storage of automobiles restricted. No disassembled, inoperable, unlicensed, junked, or wrecked motor vehicles, truck bodies, tractors, trailers, farm machinery or appliances shall be stored or allowed to remain in the open upon private property within the village for a period exceeding ten days.

Letters will be sent to property owners who do not comply. The village can and will fine/ticket those properties who remain out of compliance.

Don't know where to go with your brush, grass clippings, recyclables, etc.?

- **Brush Drop Off Site** - Located on the west side of N 1st Avenue. This site is only to be used by Village of St Nazianz properties and residents. It is not to be used by anyone who lives outside of the village limits. No garbage bags of any type are allowed at the brush drop off site. Dump your clippings and take your bag along. No dog feces are allowed at the brush drop off site.
- **2-yard Dumpster (approximate equivalent to 4 garbage carts) Rental.** The cost to rent a 2-yard dumpster is \$60/dump. NO tires. To request a dumpster, please call the Village Office.
- **Manitowoc County Recycling Center.** The recycling center holds several clean sweep events throughout the year. For more information visit their website and/or Facebook page.
- **United Ministries Thrift Store.** Located at 600 S 4th Avenue in St Nazianz. Drop off items or call 920-773-3050 for pickup.
- **Landfills.** Haul your items to Ridgeview Landfill 920-732-4473 or Hickory Meadows Landfill 920-853-8553. Call ahead for costs.
- **Scrap metal.** Contact Mike Plate 920-323-5110 with questions and fee information. He will pick up all unwanted scrap metal: washers, dryers, stoves, dishwashers, water heaters, sheet metal, heavy iron, cast iron sinks and bathtubs, car parts, batteries, rotors, rims, electric motors, wiring, copper pipe, steel pipe, brass, aluminum, lawnmowers, snow blowers, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and any appliance or metal as long as it has a cord on it. He does charge a fee for TV's based on size, and refrigerators and freezers.
