WINTER / SNOW

Winter Parking Ban

No person shall leave standing any vehicle upon any village street between the hours of 1 AM and 6 AM from **December 1 through April 1**. This will be **strictly enforced** when snow removal equipment is in operation.



Snow Removal

A reminder to property owners who have a sidewalk on your property - you are responsible to keep your sidewalk clear of snow and ice. **If the sidewalk is not clear**, village employees will clear it, and the **cost will be billed to the property owner** unless other arrangements are made with the Village Board.

Mark Property Behind the Curb

If you have any shrubs, fences, etc. that are close to the curb or street, please mark them with posts and flags. Those operating snow removal equipment need to be aware that there is something buried under the snow. Manitowoc County will be plowing snow again this year.

General

- This is the time of the year for snow and ice problems on village streets; please **cooperate with County and Village employees** during this winter season.
- For safety reasons and per village ordinance, please **refrain from blowing or shoveling snow into the street**. The village may impose a penalty of not less than \$25 nor more than \$500, together with the costs of prosecution for each offense.
- The village and county are **not** responsible for damage to lawns, etc. caused by snow removal.
- Please **keep garbage/recycling carts behind the curb** while it is snowing. This allows the plows to keep the roads clear.

DOG & CAT LICENSES

2026 dog and cat licenses are available in the village office. All dogs and cats residing in the village are required to be licensed. Certificates of current rabies vaccination must be presented when obtaining a dog or cat



license. **Fees: \$5.00 for neutered male or spayed female; \$10.00 for unneutered male or unspayed female.** To license your pet, please either mail the rabies certificate, license fee, and self-addressed stamped envelope or bring the rabies certificate and license fee to the

village office. (You can include license information with your tax payment; however, please pay with separate checks.)

There is a \$20.00 late fee per animal licensed after April 1, 2026.
